



WASTE SORTING INSTRUCTIONS



Residual waste



- ✓ Vacuum cleaner bags
- ✓ Nappies, cotton wool and sanitary towels
- ✓ Cat litter
- ✓ Milk and juice cartons
- ✓ Ash and BBQ charcoal (only in tied bags)
- ✓ Paper food packaging
- ✓ Candles
- ✓ Pizza boxes

REMEMBER if you are uncertain which category of waste you have, it should go in the residual waste container.



Food waste



- ✓ Fruit, vegetables and flowers (no roots)
- ✓ Meat and bones
- ✓ Fish and shellfish
- ✓ Egg and nut shells
- ✓ Coffee grains, coffee filters and tea bags
- ✓ Pasta, noodles and rice
- ✓ Cake and bread crumbs
- ✓ Cheese and dairy products
- ✓ Used kitchen roll and serviettes

REMEMBER to put food waste in the provided bags and remember to tie them with a knot.



Plastics



- ✓ Plastic bags and wrap
- ✓ Plastic bottles, e.g. shampoo bottles
- ✓ Plastic trays from meat, fruit and vegetables
- ✓ Plastic herb pots
- ✓ Plastic lids
- ✓ Plastic tubs (e.g. from yoghurt)

REMEMBER that all plastic packaging should be empty, rinsed and placed loose in the container.



Metal



- ✓ Tins and cans
- ✓ Beer and soft drink cans
- ✓ Foil trays and metal lids
- ✓ Bottle caps
- ✓ Clean aluminium foil
- ✓ Used tea light tubs
- ✓ Pans
- ✓ Cutlery, scissors and kitchen knives
- ✓ Nails and screws

REMEMBER that metal packaging should be empty, rinsed and placed loose in the container.



Paper



- ✓ Newspapers, magazines and advertisements
- ✓ Letters and envelopes (including "window" envelopes)
- ✓ Writing and drawing paper
- ✓ Carton packaging
- ✓ Toilet and kitchen roll tubes
- ✓ Paperback books
- ✓ Egg boxes

REMEMBER that paper should be clean (i.e. no food or grease stains) and dry. Put it in the container loose.



Glass



- ✓ Wine bottles
- ✓ Glass bottles
- ✓ Jam jars
- ✓ Preserve jars
- ✓ Drinking glasses

REMEMBER that glass packaging should be empty, rinsed and placed loose in the container. Any plastic or metal lids should be removed.
